April 2019 Bunny Basket (Use a scant ¼" seam allowance on all seams)

Basket colors and bunny fabric (your choice):



Basket Color A (shown as pink below): (5) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

(2) 2-1/2" squares

Basket color B (shown as blue below): (2) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

(6) 2-1/2" squares


Bunny fabric: ~7" x 10" (see appliqué pattern)

Cream background fabric: (1) 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles


(2) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

(6) 2-1/2" squares

1-Flying geese units for basket: Stack 2-1/2" square color B (blue) on right lower corner of Color A (pink) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle, right sides together. Draw diagonal line and stitch on marked line. Trim seam allowance and press. Repeat for lower left corner.











Using this method make additional flying geese units as shown below:






2- Assemble basket rows: Sew flying geese units into rows. Press seams in opposite directions.



3- Lower basket unit: Sew Rows 2 and 3 together, matching seams and press. Sew a cream background 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle to the right and left sides of lower basket unit (see below) and press.



4- Sew row 1 to lower basket unit, matching seams and press.



5- Sew cream background $6-1/2" \times 12-1/2"$ rectangle to top of basket and press seam allowance. The block should measure 12-1/2" square.

6- Appliqué bunny to block. Position bunny so that the 2 lower feet slightly overlap the basket and legs are approximately 1-1/2" from the right and left sides of the block. Check the ear location. It should be greater than ¼" from the top edge so that it does not fall within the seam allowance for the block. I used a fusible method. Finish with satin, zig-zag, or blanket stitch.
