

Sunflower Block



Use a cream background fabric. Remaining flower fabrics your choice.

Flower center: 4-1/2" square

Flower color A (shown as light yellow):

(4) 2-1/2" squares

2-1/2" x 20" strip


Flower color B (shown as dark gold):

(4) 4-1/2" squares


2-1/2" x 20" strip

Cream background: (12) 2-1/2" squares

1-Square in a square units: Stack a cream 2-1/2" square on the corner of the color B 4-1/2" square, right sides together. On the back of the cream square, mark a diagonal line and stitch on the marked diagonal. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabric. Repeat with the opposite corner. Stack a color A 2-1/2" square on one corner. Repeat process above. On last corner, stack a cream background 2-1/2" square and repeat process above. This unit should measure 4-1/2" square. Make 4 of these units.



2-Strip units: Sew flower color B 2-1/2" x 20" strip to flower color A 2-1/2" x 20" strip. Press seam allowance. Cut this unit into (4) 4-1/2" pieces (there will be some left over).



3-Sew blocks into rows: Rows 1 and 3: Using the block diagram as a guide, sew Square in a square unit + Strip unit + Square in a square unit – Watch orientation of the Color B triangle in the square in a square. Row 2: Sew Strip unit + Flower center + Strip unit. Press seams in opposite directions.

4-Assemble rows to complete block. Press seam allowances. Your block should measure 12-1/2" square.
