
Towers of Camelot

Color A: Orange


- (1) 5 1/4" square
- (4) 2 ½" squares
- (2) 4 7/8" squares

Color B: White

- (1) 5 ¼" square
- (4) 4 7/8" squares
- (1) 4 ½" square




Stack (2) of the White 4 7/8" squares and cut them once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles.



Stack one Orange and White 4 7/8" square right sides together with all edges aligned. On the back of the top square lightly mark a line on the diagonal. Sew 1/4" above and below the marked diagonal. Cut apart on the marked diagonal between

the rows of stitching. This will give you two half squares. Press seams towards darker fabrics. This should measure as a 4-1/2" square. Repeat with the remaining Orange and White 47/8" square.




Now cut the Orange and White 5 1/4" squares twice on the diagonal to get four quarter square triangles of each.




Sew pairs of quarter square triangles together to make two each of the units shown at left. Press seams to the darker side. You will need two units with the orange triangle on the left and two of orange on the right.




Sew each of the pieced quarter square triangles to a White half square triangle. Trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed.





Now place an Orange 2-1/2" square right sides together and outside edges aligned with the White 4-1/2" square. On the back of the small square draw in the diagonal and sew on this drawn line. Cut off the

excess seam allowance and press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another White square on the opposite corner, and then on the two adjacent corners. Trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed.



Lay out all the block's units as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the outside and the middle row seam to the center. Sew the rows together, and it's done!
