June 2022 -2023

Pinwheel 12 1/2"

White: 4 x 3 1/2" squares

4 x (3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles)

Polka Dots: 4 x (3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles)

Contrasting/complementary fabric: 4 x 3 ½" squares

- 1) Draw a diagonal line on each of the white 3 ½" squares. This is a sewing line. Place a marked white square on the <u>left side</u> of a polka dot rectangle right sides together and stitch on the line. Trim to a ¼" seam and press seam open. Repeat with remaining white 3 ½" squares and polka dot rectangles.
- 2) Draw a diagonal line on each of the contrasting 3 ½" squares. This is a sewing line. Place a marked contrasting square on the <u>right side</u> of a polka dot rectangle right sides together and stitch on the line. Trim to a ½" seam and press seam open. Repeat with remaining contrasting 3 ½" squares and polka dot rectangles.
- 3) There should be 4 flying geese units, with the white fabric on the left side and polka dot fabric on the right. Sew each of the flying geese units to a white 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle along the top edge. Press seam toward the white rectangle.
- 4) Arrange the 4 blocks according to the diagram. Sew together with a ¼" seam Press.
